

FAQs (see the [District Glossary](#) for common terms)

What platform will my student be logging on to?

All classrooms will use STRIDE. Your teacher will share login information with families no later than April 9th. Teachers will also use Google Classroom for additional links and support.

How can we get extra help from teachers?

Every teacher will have office hours at least 4 times a week. Teachers will share those hours and the best way to contact them.

Will my student have to log in everyday?

Please see the virtual schedule and your teacher's classroom communication for more details.

Will my student have to participate in video conferencing?

Students will have to participate in video conferencing for some instruction.

Will my student's IEP, 504, or tutoring services continue?

Yes, IEP, 504, and tutoring services will be adjusted for virtual learning.

How will teachers take attendance?

Students are expected to actively participate in virtual learning. Attendance will be measured in accordance with Section 14 Emergency Temporary Virtual Education (Adaptive Learning) of Chapter 41 Virtual Education Emergency Rules. Documentation will be maintained by the teacher, school, and district level to support attendance. If we do not hear from you or your child after attempting to contact you for ten school days, your child's enrollment will be dropped.

How much time is my student expected to spend learning each week?

K-2 students will have 60 minutes of Math (20 minutes of this time will be independent practice using Stride Academy) , 60 minutes of ELA (20 minutes of this time will be independent practice using Stride Academy), 15 minutes of Art, 15 minutes of Music, and 15 minutes of PE. Science and social studies will be part of ELA.

3-5 students will have 60 minutes of Math (20 minutes of this time will be independent practice using Stride Academy), 60 minutes of ELA (20 minutes of this time will be independent practice using Stride Academy), 30 minutes of Science, 15 minutes of Art, 15 minutes of Music, and 15 minutes of PE. Social studies will be part of math and ELA.

Can my student do more than the minimum?

Of course! Please let your teacher know if you would like further enrichment opportunities. You can also have students complete more independent practice on Stride.

What if we don't have a way to connect online?

We will work with you to get connected. If you need paper packets, they will be provided for you.

What are expectations of me as a parent or guardian?

Parents and guardians are responsible for

- Assisting students to be ready for virtual learning
- Providing a space to learn without interruption
- Communicating with teachers during office hours

How will the school communicate with me?

Our first method of communication will always be email - **please make sure your email is up-to-date in Infinite Campus**. If it is not, please let your classroom teacher know, and we will help you.
